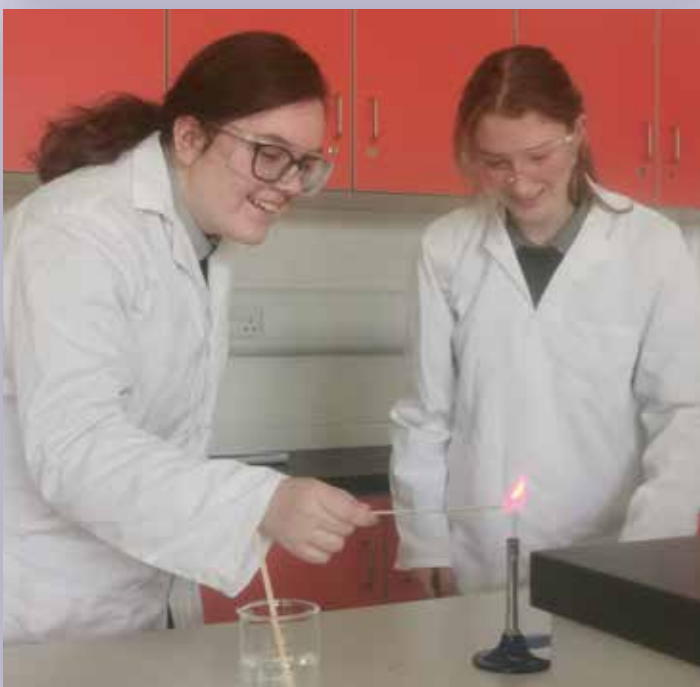

HOME SCHOOL COMMUNITY LIAISON

A vital link between school and home, the HSCL coordinator runs a parents' room in the school where parents can drop-in at any time. Any arising issues can be discussed in confidence in a supporting environment.

A transfer programme for incoming first year students eases the transition from Primary to Post-Primary school. Information evenings are also organised for parents. Parents are invited to attend maths classes enabling them to help and support their child with maths homework. A shared reading programme is in place during the first term to enhance students' literacy skills, making textbooks more accessible to all students. Home visits can be organised, and parents are encouraged to be involved in school life. The coordinator also provides a link between the Parents' Council and the Students' Council.



CURRICULUM

Lanesboro Community College follows the curriculum as directed by the Department of Education.

JUNIOR CYCLE

Subjects taken by the Junior Cycle students include both core subjects and optional subjects. The core subjects are English, Irish, Mathematics, Science, French or German and History. Wellbeing is an important part of the new Junior Cycle Programme and includes Physical Education, CSPE, SPHE and Guidance. Students also study Religion. Students are given the opportunity to sample all optional subjects six weeks before deciding which subjects, they wish to continue to study. The optional

subjects include Music, Geography, Business Studies, Wood Technology, Engineering, Art, Home Economics and Graphics.

JCSP- This subject compliments the Junior Cycle and students broaden their horizons with projects such as a reading challenge, make-a- book project and many other initiatives throughout the year.

Wellbeing:- The promotion of Wellbeing is central to our mission in our school to enable students to achieve their full potential and contribute to society in a meaningful way. The school plays a vital role in the promotion of Wellbeing through a range of activities to support and enhance the mental, emotional, social and spiritual development of all young people including co-curricular and extra-curricular activities..

LEAVING CERTIFICATE

The Leaving Certificate Programme is a 2-year programme and subjects taken by students include both core subjects and optional subjects. The core subjects are English, Irish, Mathematics and French or German. The non-exam subjects include Religion, Physical Education, Guidance and SPHE. Students select 3 optional subjects from the following: Biology, Music, Geography, Physics, Accounting, Business, Chemistry, Construction, Art, Engineering, Design and Communication Graphics and Home Economics. LCVP runs alongside the traditional Leaving Certificate programme choices. Student's study two modules - Enterprise Education and Preparation for the World of Work - over the two years. LCVP points are accepted for entry into all third level programmes.

MATHS WEEK:

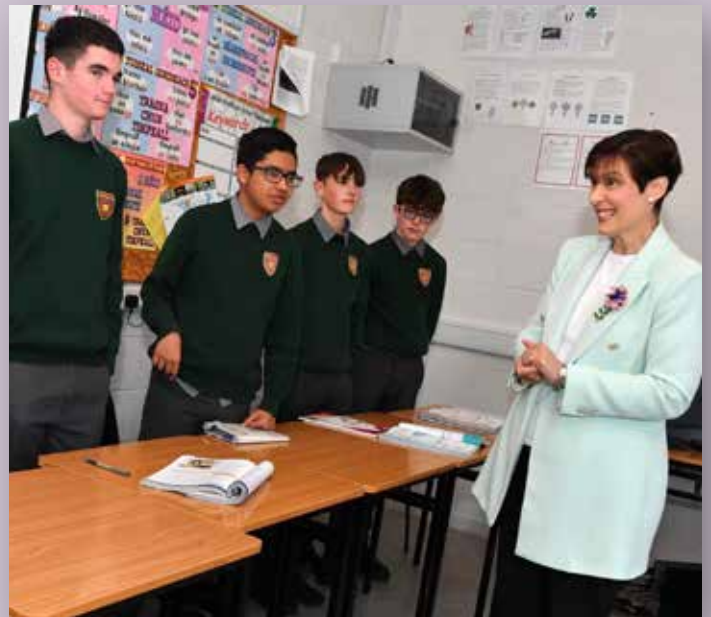
Local primary school children are invited to join our students for fun maths activities.
